You will see that the date of first payment must remain blank. This will allow us to collect subscriptions up to and at the AGM, for 2013. Then the Standing Order will automatically pay the £3 in November of next year for 2014 and so on.

The garages behind Aston Court 14 Lansdowne Road

The owner of these garages behind this block of flats has applied to demolish them and build a house in their place. SRRA have strongly objected to this proposal in conjunction with several local residents. The proposed development would be very intrusive and would totally compromise the privacy of the surrounding dwellings. The first planning application for this site was withdrawn, but the latest version is virtually the same and is equally out of place. We are waiting for the planning department's decision.

31b Arterberry Road

There had been very little action on this site for a while. The developer has decided to sell the site and not build the house for which planning permission was eventually granted. Demolition has begun, but as yet none of the rubble has been removed, causing great concern over the very small driveway over which 31b has a right of way.

Gym in the garden of 17 Crescent RoadSRRA joined residents in Arterberry Road in

objecting to this proposal as it intruded on gardens and the planning department agreed. However the owners of 17 Crescent Road took the case to appeal and permission was granted, with certain constraints as to the preservation of trees.

Controlled Parking Zones

Earlier in the year controlled parking was introduced to The Downs, Lansdowne Road and Crescent Road. This moved the parking problem West and the situation became impossible in Arterberry Road. The result is that a Controlled

Parking Zone is to be introduced in The Drive, Arterberry Road, Montana Road, Dunmore Road and Langham Road. It would seem the scheme will be fully in action early in the New Year. The initial restrictions will be all day Monday to Friday. There is however a strong feeling that a two hour gap in the middle of the day would suffice. The status quo will have to remain for a year but we will be canvassing the area in a year's time

The Belvederes

Bill Petch attended the Street Management
Advisory Committee and spoke on behalf of
SRRA. The proposed scheme for the Belvedere
area is an experimental Traffic Management
Scheme. The valid fear is that "experimental"
becomes permanent. Not surprisingly, some
residents are keen on the scheme. Virtually all
the speakers including four Councillors spoke
against the scheme and the committee also
voted against the scheme. Councillor Judge has
still to opine despite the weight of opinion against.
We shall watch this carefully.

Raynes Park Community Forum 6th December

The Raynes Park Health Centre will be handed over in mid January. Two GP practices should be in action by the end of the month. Kingston Hospital will operate a limited out patients facility, assisted by St Anthony's. The Nelson Hospital will be shut for two years to re-emerge as Warden Assisted Housing, a Geriatric clinic and another Health Centre combining two GPs practices. Progress on improving the Station and its environs is slow due mostly to the inertia of Network Rail. There will be no Free Christmas Parking by Waitrose. There is a move afoot to apply for two hour free parking slots next year.

We will be circulating a newsletter in February with details of the AGM and more.
