School Streets

I am fairly sure School Streets have caused more correspondence from our members than any other issue. Whatever your views on their benefits, which I think are very limited, I am sure the style of their introduction was underhand. There was no publicity (in Wandsworth all residents had a flier through the door warning them of the proposals) and the only way any of you found out about them was by being fined or by word of mouth from others who have been fined. I am afraid they are here to stay, so please take care.

ULEZ Expansion

It would seem likely that the Ultra-Low Emission Zone will be expanded to our area in 2023. This will be painful for anyone with a non-compliant vehicle. It will cost them £12.50 every time they take their car out. I am trying to ascertain the best way to fight this. There are several petitions in circulation, but I believe Transport for London are supposed to be consulting on the subject. I am a little cynical about how effective that will be as there is a suspicion that the new ULEZ charges rather than battling pollution will help to fill the black hole the Mayor has created in the TFL coffers.

Parking Charges

The Council pulled back on their outrageous emission based parking charges just before this year's local elections! I will keep you posted as to any further developments.

20 mph Speed Limit

This is the last item on motoring! There is, as I am sure you know, a general 20 mph speed limit over the whole borough. This I am afraid is here to stay. One minor piece of good news is the Council have stepped back on the limit on the Bushey Road which is going up to 30 mph. It is after all a dual carriageway.

Parkside will continue to be a challenge in quiet times and, be warned: apart from the one fixed camera, the police have taken to setting up mobile speed checks.

AELTC Proposed Developments

I am sure you are all aware of the All England's proposals to develop a large swathe of the golf course opposite their site in Church Road. This area is Metropolitan Open Land (the urban equivalent of Green Belt). Had the plans just involved low level courts I think there would have been a small amount of opposition. However they have applied to construct an 8,000 seater covered court and there are a vast number of local residents and organisations opposing the plans. I will keep you posted.

Planning

There are, at the moment, very few planning issues in or adjacent to our SRRA area. There are however early rumblings of possible major developments at the top of the Downs.

Street Scene

My feeling is that street cleaning has improved, to some extent. I am convinced this is due to the employment of a man with a broom and bags rather than the large machine that invariably cannot sweep the whole road due to parked cars.

Anyway, it will soon be the leaf sweeping season so we will see.

Fly tipping is still a major problem, but I must admit the Council seem to arrive very quickly to clear up if they are alerted.

There is always the problem of foxes getting to the food rubbish overnight and spreading it over the road.

One possible solution is do not put the food rubbish out until the morning. I believe it is not usually the first collection.

And do make sure the caddy handle is in the locked position – which is forward and down. If you leave the handle standing up, foxes can easily knock it backwards and open the caddy.

Aircraft Noise and Leaf Blowers

I have put these two together as they have both become an annual rant from me.

We have had a massive increase in aircraft taking off over our area. This is to a large extent due to a post pandemic increase in flights as well as many days of Easterly winds.

If you are concerned I feel it would not go amiss to complain to Heathrow at *noise@heathrow.com* then at least they will realise we have noticed. You will get a response.

Petrol driven leaf blowers drive many people mad, me included, especially in Spring and Summer. We now have new local councillors and I am going to see if we can do anything about them for at least the noisiest time of the year.
