Planning Issues

Our whole area is full of expanding homes, whether in the form of roof conversions, extra buildings in the garden or extensions. I am often asked for advice on this subject and what I always say is please discuss your intentions with your neighbours in advance. So many problems can be resolved in this way. As the old advertisement used to say, "It's good to talk".

We do however have one major planning issue looming and that is the proposal to build a block of flats behind Wimbledon Close and Upton Court in The Downs. The SRRA and a very active group of local residents fought a similar scheme on this site several years ago and permission was refused. As I write, no official planning application has been lodged, but we have formed an action group to oppose this development and will keep you posted.

School Streets, ULEZ Expansion and 20 mph Limit

Whatever your feelings, I am afraid these three measures are here to stay. Take care especially with regard to School Streets which I find very poorly signposted. For those of you who may not be aware, these are streets adjacent to schools from which motor traffic is banned for a period in the morning and a period in the afternoon during term time. They all have cameras installed.

Aircraft Noise

This has without a doubt increased exponentially in our area. This I realise has to a certain extent been caused by the number of days with the wind in the East, but there are generally more planes taking off over our heads. I know it is slightly "nimbyish", and I do not see the harm in that, but I would recommend, if you are concerned, emailing noise@heathrow.com. You will get a response. I do not know how much effect it will have, but at least the authorities will realise we have noticed and are not happy.

Street Scene

Road sweeping and tree pruning seem to vary massively from one road to another. One classic example is Devas Road which has perfectly clear gutters, whereas those in Montana Road bear a startling resemblance to the herbaceous borders at Wisley. If you have concerns keep complaining to the Council and involve your local Councillors. Do not give up! On a positive note, even though it is sad it is needed, the Council's fly tipping clearance service is very efficient.

Walk and Talk

Many of you may also be aware of this excellent movement. It is best described by this from the national website www.walkandtalkmovement.org:

AELTC Proposed Development

I am sure you are all aware of the All England's proposals to develop a large swathe of the golf course opposite their site in Church Road. This is Metropolitan Open Land (the urban equivalent of Green Belt). Had the plans simply involved low level courts I think there would have been very little opposition. But they seem intent on bulldozing through proposals for an 8,000 seater covered court and there are a vast number of local residents and organisations opposed to these plans. New Subscription Payment Method

In these increasingly cashless times, it has become more and more inconvenient for members to find £3.00 down the back of the sofa when Road Reps call to collect subscriptions every Autumn. Having researched what other local residents' associations are doing about this problem, we have set up a new, convenient and secure direct debit system for paying subscriptions with GoCardless. Some of you may have experience of GoCardless through other organisations you belong to. They are a highly reputable operator used by several respected organisations including HM Government.

We will introduce the system gradually, so that those of you who pay by standing order (some 60% of members) can continue to do so. From now on, though, Road Reps on their Autumn rounds will ask all new members to pay by direct

debit, and they will gently invite the 40% of members who currently still pay by cash to switch to the direct debit system if they possibly can. I very much hope that most of you who pay your subs by cash will agree to switch when invited to do so by your Road Rep, as it will be so much easier for you, and very much more efficient and less time-consuming for our doughty Road Reps and our hard-working Treasurer and Membership Secretary to operate. From your point of view, as one member put it recently, you will find it 'a doddle' to switch.
